REASON FOR RECOMMENDATION PROVIDED:
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A Preliminary Ecological Appraisal appears to be missing from the planning portal - this should be provided for review. • The individual ecological reports provided are satisfactory and recommendations should be carried out to good practice guidance. • The Site lies partially within a Swift alert zone in which any new development should follow Swifts and Planning Guidance Note. • The Interim Bat Report indicates the full suite of bat activity surveys, automated static bat detector surveys and analysis have not been completed. It is stated the additional survey data will be submitted in a finalised report once completed, with recommendations made based on activity levels and species composition recorded to date. This should be provided for review once completed.
BIODIVERSITY NET GAIN (BNG) specific comments:
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Condition assessment was undertaken at optimal time of year (June) to good practice guidance. • The current illustrative master plan achieves a net gain of 17.63% habitat units and 10.17% hedgerow units. The proposed plans are feasible, however a draft version of the Habitat Management and Monitoring Plan (HMMP) is recommended to evidence how these habitats will be achieved to the condition stated, particularly how the existing high fertility agricultural grassland will be reduced in fertility to enable achieve 'good' quality 'other neutral grassland' to be created. • River Condition Assessment should be undertaken as the site boundary appears to lie within 10m of the pLWS Ratby, tributaries of Rothley Brook.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Preliminary Ecological Appraisal • River Condition Assessment • Completed bat surveys. Please note that ODPM Regulations require protected species surveys to be submitted prior to determination of a planning application. It is also essential that the extent that they may be affected by the proposed development is established before the planning permission is granted. Reference: Paragraph 99 of ODPM Circular 06/2005 (Biodiversity and Geological Conservation – Statutory Obligations and their Impact within the Planning System). Any further protected species surveys determined to be required must be completed and submitted prior to determination.
