<ul style="list-style-type: none">The proposed development consists of the erection of one dwelling to be constructed on land adjacent to 22 Elwell Avenue, sited within a predominantly residential area. It is understood the works will not affect or alter the existing dwelling on the site.The Biodiversity Net Gain (BNG) report and metric have been viewed alongside the photographs taken of the area which show a garden setting and surrounding hedgerow.However, the metric does not appear to represent the changes in post development for this current application.Therefore, an updated BNG metric and report is required in order to accurately reflect the changes of this proposal highlighted within the proposed plans. Or alternatively, the BNG Metric can be resubmitted showing only the baseline of the site.	

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Design & Access statement also states a small section of the hedge will need to be removed to facilitate the car parking provision and will need to be considered within the metric. Please see the following recommended informative.
