REASON FOR RECOMMENDATION:		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • An Ecological Appraisal completed by Learn Ecology in December 2025 has been submitted with the application which is accepted and briefly outlined below. • The application site is located directly adjacent to the River Anker an important wildlife corridor and could be indirectly impacted on by construction. The proposals should be sited a minimum of 10m away from the bank, retaining the scrub and riparian habitat. If this is not possible then further surveys for otter and water vole will be required. <p>Reptiles</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The site is considered suitable for reptiles due to the adjacent River Anker corridor and on-site habitat. Therefore, further reptile surveys are required to be undertaken at the appropriate time of year. • There is a holding objection until these surveys are completed. 		

- Majority of the site comprises of other neutral grassland where part will be lost due to the proposals. There will be a requirement to compensate for the loss of this grassland to ensure a net gain for biodiversity. Enhancement of the remaining neutral grassland should be detailed within a Landscape and Ecological Management Plan (LEMP). **Please see recommended Conditions.**

- A Construction and Environmental Management Plan (Biodiversity) will be required to protect the following habitats and species during construction: River Anker, the priority habitat: deciduous woodland, boundary hedgerows and trees. A series of precautionary working methods for: badger, otter, water vole and hedgehogs. As suitable habitat is present on site and in the wider landscape. Please see recommended Conditions.

Bats

- Artificial light spill on adjacent vegetation should be kept to a minimum to reduce disturbance of foraging and commuting bats.

Birds

- No evidence of nesting birds were observed during the survey. The trees and hedgerows do provide nesting habitat, and any vegetation clearance should take place outside the bird nesting season. **Please see recommended Informatives.**

Biodiversity Enhancement

- The ecology report is recommending a series of enhancements which should be included within a landscape enhancement plan condition. These include:
 - One integrated bat box
 - Two integrated bird boxes including a sparrow terrace and swallow or house martin nest cups
 - Any new close board fencing installed which may fragment the landscape for hedgehog should include a 13cm x 13cm hole at the base to allow for hedgehog migration through the site.
 - Construction of a hedgehog hibernaculum
 - **Please see recommended Conditions.**
- Any specific mitigation or enhancement relating to reptiles can be provided once the ecology survey has been submitted and reviewed.

BNG Specific

- The application is exempt from biodiversity net gain as it is a self-build and custom build development.

ANY RECOMMENDED CONDITIONS TO BE APPLIED:

- **CEMP: Biodiversity** - No development shall take place (including ground works or vegetation clearance) until a Construction Environment Management Plan for biodiversity (CEMP: Biodiversity) has been submitted to and approved in writing by the LPA. The CEMP shall include the following details:
 - Identification of potentially damaging construction activities on the River Anker
 - practical measures and sensitive working practices to avoid or reduce impacts during construction on: other neutral grassland, badgers, otter water vole and hedgehogs
 - timing of works to avoid harm to nesting birds
 - responsible persons for overseeing sensitive works
 - use of protective fencing where required to safeguard hedges and trees

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The approved CEMP shall be adhered to and implemented throughout the construction period, unless otherwise agreed in writing by the LPA. • Landscape and Ecological Management Plan - No development shall take place (including ground works or vegetation clearance) until a Landscape and Ecological Management Plan (LEMP) has been submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority. The LEMP shall include the following details: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> A. description and evaluation of the features to be created/enhanced B. aims and objectives of management C. appropriate management options for achieving aims and objectives D. prescriptions for management actions E. work schedule F. species/seed mixes to be planted/sown G. ongoing monitoring and remedial measures The approved plan will be implemented in accordance with the approved details.
ANY RECOMMENDED INFORMATIVES TO BE APPLIED:
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Nesting Birds - Nesting birds are protected under the Wildlife & Countryside Act 1981 (as amended); therefore, building demolition and significant alteration or vegetation clearance should take place outside the breeding season (March to August inclusive) unless carefully checked beforehand by a suitably qualified person.
